

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

FOREST OF DEAN DISTRICT COUNCIL WOOLASTON Footpath FWO 9 (Part) - DIVERSION PUBLIC PATH ORDER 2020

Deadline for comments: 23RD September 2020

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990, SECTION 257 AND PARAGRAPH 1 OF SCHEDULE 14

The above Order was made on the 14 August 2020. The effect of the order as made is TO STOP UP the entire width of that length of WOOLASTON Footpath No. FWO 9 running from the boundary of "Woodlands" house at SO 5805 0112 (Point B) in an initial west south-westerly direction then turning in a southerly direction before heading in a south-westerly direction for a total distance of approximately 46m to the immediate south of ""Woodlands" house SO 5802 0112 (Point A) as shown between Points B - A on the plan attached to the Order and CREATE an alternative route with an unenclosed width of 2m running from the boundary of "Woodlands" house SO 5805 0112 (Point B) in a west north-westerly direction for approximately 65m opposite "Woodside House" SO 5799 0116 (Point C) as shown between points B –C.

If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if so made are withdrawn, **Forest of Dean District Council** may itself confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the order is sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation any representations or objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent with the order.
