PUBLIC HEALTH ACT 1936

LICENCE CONDITIONS FOR TENT SITES

1. The licence shall be applied for annually and will terminate on the Thirty-first day of December of each year in respect of which it is granted.
2. The use of the site shall be permitted during the following periods of each year, that is from the First day of March until the Thirty-first day of October inclusive.
3. No caravans or moveable dwellings other than tents shall be stationed on the site at any time.
4. The site shall be limited to the area defined on the attached plan in red.
5. Sufficient water closets or chemical closets shall be provided at the rate of one closet for every five tents, or part thereof, with separate accommodation for the sexes. Such closets are to be situated as to be within reasonable distance of all parts of the site. There shall be provided suitable wash-hand basins with the piped supply of wholesome water, at the ratio of one wash-hand basin for every three closets or part thereof.
6. The licensee shall accept full responsibility for the conditions, cleaning and emptying of all closets, and other facilities on the site, and where chemical closets are used, shall provide a satisfactory means of disposal of closet contents in an approved situation that will not be within the boundary of the camp site.
7. The licensee shall provide in convenient positions, a sufficient number of suitable refuse receptacles for use on the site and shall accept full responsibility for the disposal of the contents in a satisfactory manner.
8. The licensee shall provide a means of disposing of waste liquids to the satisfaction of the Local Authority.
9. The grass on the site shall be kept cut short, while the site is in use, and the site shall be kept free of litter and any form of nuisance.
10. The licensee shall take steps to ensure that no nuisance arises from noise, smoke, etc. to neighbouring properties.
11. There shall be provided such fire-fighting equipment and facilities as may be reasonably required by the Chief Fire Officer for the County of Gloucester.
